# Tackle the Mindset - Code of Conduct



### 1. Purpose

This Code of Conduct sets the standard for behaviour expected from all staff, volunteers, participants, and partners involved in Tackle the Mindset programs. It ensures a safe, respectful, and positive environment where everyone can thrive.

#### 2. Core Values

All conduct must reflect our three guiding principles:

- Discipline Commitment to structure, punctuality, and personal responsibility
- Respect For self, others, and the game
- Ambition Striving for growth, effort, and excellence

## 3. Expectations for Staff and Volunteers

All coaches, assistants, and volunteers must:

- Act as positive role models at all times
- Treat all participants with dignity and fairness
- Maintain professional boundaries and avoid favouritism
- Arrive prepared, on time, and appropriately dressed
- Use positive reinforcement and avoid shouting or humiliation
- Never use physical punishment or inappropriate language
- Report any safeguarding concerns immediately to the DSL
- Follow all health and safety procedures and risk assessments
- Uphold confidentiality and data protection standards

### 4. Expectations for Participants

All young people involved in our sessions are expected to:

- Show respect to coaches, peers, and equipment
- Listen carefully and follow instructions
- Try their best and support their teammates
- Use appropriate language and behaviour
- Report any concerns or unsafe behaviour to a coach
- Represent Tackle the Mindset with pride and integrity

#### 5. Expectations for Parents and Carers

We ask parents and carers to:

- Encourage fair play and effort over winning
- Support their child's participation and development
- Communicate respectfully with staff and other families
- Avoid coaching from the sidelines
- Raise concerns privately and constructively
- Ensure children arrive on time and with appropriate kit

#### 6. Breaches of Conduct

Any breach of this Code will be taken seriously. Depending on the nature of the incident, actions may include:



- Verbal reminders or warnings
- Temporary or permanent removal from sessions
- Referral to safeguarding authorities or partner organisations

## 7. Agreement

All staff, volunteers, and participants (or their parents/carers) will be asked to read and agree to this Code of Conduct before taking part in any Tackle the Mindset activity.

### 8. Review

This Code is reviewed annually or following any significant incident or change in legislation.
